# How does it work?



**Audio Description** is a live verbal commentary providing information on the visual elements of a production as it unfolds. It describes action that is essential to the understanding of the story, as well as other information such as the style and design, sets, costumes, facial expressions and visual jokes. Description is delivered around the dialogue through a discreet headset.

---



At a **Captioned Performance**, the words are displayed on a screen placed near or in the set and can be seen at the same time as they are spoken or sung. Speakers' names, sound effects and offstage noises are also shown. A trained captioner prepares the script in advance to mirror the rhythm and flow of the performance and the captions are delivered live as the action happens on stage.

At **British Sign Language Interpreted Performances** (BSL Interpreted) an interpreter will stand in a clearly visible position and interpret the spoken and heard aspects of the show.

---



**Relaxed and Chilled Performances** are adapted in a number of ways to reduce anxiety and create a supportive atmosphere, including adjusting light and sound levels, providing 'chill-out' areas and demonstrating an embracing attitude towards audience noise and movement in the auditorium. Chilled performances take a more casual approach to noise and movement in the auditorium, but the performance itself is unchanged. This performance is ideal for people who feel more at ease knowing they can go in and out of the auditorium during the show.

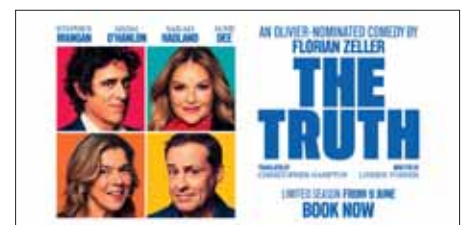

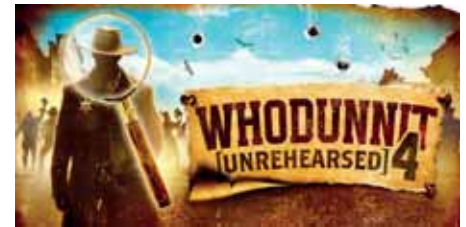
